## Message from the Principal: Ms. Geiser

Since my first day of Kindergarten, I knew I wanted to be a teacher. In the 35 years since then, I have thought many times that "education is the best job ever!" Being in a school is indeed a unique experience and one that brings a deeper value than just learning about academics. What are some of the other perks that come along with sending your child to a school? Here are a few that I've been thinking about:

- **Friendships.** School is a wonderful time to learn about being a good friend. There are many opportunities in a day's time to interact, laugh, problem solve, and communicate. Hopefully friendships here can lead to positive peer pressure and life-long relationships.
- Adult Mentors. I believe it is incredibly important for children to have other
  adults speaking into their lives besides their parents. Those of you who have
  tweens or teens know that sometimes it's just difficult for a child to listen to
  something simply because it's coming from their parents. However, a trusted
  teacher can pull them aside, tell them the same thing, and the child
  somehow is able to hear the message.
- Being a small part of a larger group. When a student is in a classroom with 22 other classmates, their every desire won't be met, they won't always get to play the game that they want to at recess, and they might not always get to work with their best friend on a project and all of that is okay, because children need to know that the world does not revolve around them. It's important for them to see what it looks like to put others first, to share, and to pivot when things don't go exactly as they want them to go.
- Variety in Teaching Methods. In a school, students will be in contact with a wide variety of teachers over a course of many years, and they will like some more than others. However, it's important for them to see the value in a variety of teaching methods and classroom management systems. Students need to be able to read the room and build emotional intelligence to understand the different settings they are in from hour to hour or year to year.
- **Community**. Last year at a basketball game, I saw a younger student who I didn't think had any real connection to any of the players on the court. I asked him who he was there to watch and he proudly stated, "The Flames!" He didn't know the names of the players, but he knew that they were the Flames and so was he. People need to know that they are part of a group or community.

Hopefully, your students are gaining more from GMS than knowledge of the core subjects. I pray they are finding good friends, developing trusted mentors in their teachers, learning how to adapt to a variety of classroom settings, discovering the benefits of putting others first, and feeling like they are an integral part of our GMS community. We are privileged to have them!
